Establishing a Scholarship Fund with the Central Alabama Community Foundation, allows you to help make the dream of higher education a reality for students.

As a donor, you can create a scholarship to benefit students graduating from a particular school or attending a specified college or university. You can choose to designate a particular field of study or define other qualifying criteria.

Your fund is established according to your values and goals. This ensures that your giving priorities are met. Each year, our Vice President - Community Services coordinates the application process, recipient selection and payment process in its entirety.

An easy application form is used to simplify the application process for students and is available on our website. A selection committee will determine eligible recipients for your award.

You can add to your fund at anytime with a gift of cash, appreciated stock, real estate, mutual funds, or other assets.

Through its scholarship funds, Central Alabama Community Foundation awards over \$300,000 each year to students from Autauga, Coffee, Dale, Elmore, Geneva, Henry, Houston, Lowndes, Macon, Montgomery, and Pike counties. The return on investment in our students' continued education is significant in preparing them to be future leaders of our community.

HERE'S HOW IT WORKS:

- 1. You make a gift to CACF. You can give cash, appreciated stock, real estate, mutual funds or any other assets.**
- 2. We set up the Scholarship Fund with the name you choose.**
- 3. You can create a scholarship for students from a particular school, for those attending a specific college or enrolled in a specific area of study. You choose the criteria for determining the recipient/s and have a voice in selecting the recipient/s.**
- 4. We handle all the administrative details and annually present the awards to the recipients (you may choose to be present for the presentations).**
- 5. You can encourage your family and friends to donate to your scholarship fund (they will also receive tax advantages) through easy online giving on our website.**
